Jerry Schnepf

Dr. Jerry Schnepf is Chair of the Computer Science Department at Judson University. Prior to his appointment to this role, he served as Associate Professor of Visual Communication Technology at Bowling Green State University. He teaches courses in Design Systems, Data Structures, Interactive Media, Usability, User Experience, and Augmented and Virtual Reality. His research efforts focus on STEM Education, Learner Experience Design, Technology for Online Assessment, Interactive Mobile Learning, and Computerized Sign Language Synthesis. He is the recipient of the 2022 BGSU Faculty Mentor of the Year Award, the 2018 Elliott L Blinn Award for his work supporting undergraduate research and creative work, and the 2018 Faculty Excellence Award from the Association of Technology Management and Applied Engineering.

Lisa K. Hanasono

Dr. Lisa K. Hanasono is an associate professor in the School of Media and Communication and an affiliated faculty member of the American Culture Studies Program and Women's, Gender and Sexuality Studies Program at Bowling Green State University. Dr. Hanasono's research focuses on how institutions of higher education and individuals communicate to reduce inequities, stop discrimination, and support the career advancement of minoritized scholars. She is a Co-PI of a nearly \$1 million NSF ADVANCE Adaptation grant and has delivered over 70 presentations and workshops on topics related to faculty development, academic leadership, and inclusive pedagogy. Her scholarship is published in journals such as the *Journal of Diversity in Higher Education*, *Communication Research*, *Communication Quarterly*, and the *Journal of International and Intercultural Communication*.

W. John Koolage

Dr. W. John Koolage is the Director of General Education and Professor of Philosophy in the Department of History and Philosophy at Eastern Michigan University. His areas of expertise include General and Feminist Philosophy of Science as well as the Scholarship of Teaching and Learning. His most recent scholarly work appears in *Science in Context* and *Teaching Philosophy*.

Mary-Jon Ludy

Dr. Mary-Jon Ludy is Chair of the Department of Public & Allied Health and Associate Professor of Food & Nutrition at Bowling Green State University (BGSU). Dr. Ludy received the Academy of Nutrition & Dietetics Commission on Dietetic Registration Leadership Award (2022), BGSU's Faculty Senate Award for Leadership as a Chair (2022), and BGSU's Undergraduate Faculty Mentor of the Year Award (2017). Her findings have been published in the *American Journal of Clinical Nutrition*, the *Journal of American College Health*, and *Nutrients* as well as highlighted by *CNN*, *Consumer Reports*, and *The New York Times*. Dr. Ludy holds a professional appointment to the State Medical Board of Ohio's Dietetics Advisory Council and is Past-President of the Ohio Academy of Nutrition & Dietetics.

Dr. Elise Radina is Associate Dean for the Graduate School at Miami University. Prior to her current role she served as Associate Dean for Research, Faculty Development, and Graduate Education for the College of Education, Health, and Society and Chair of the Department of Family Science and Social Work at Miami University. Dr. Radina earned her BS in International Women's Studies from Allegheny College, her MS in Child and Family Studies from Miami University, and her PhD in Human Development and Family Studies from the University of Missouri. Dr. Radina is co-editor (with A. Humble) of the book *Real Stories of How Qualitative Data Analysis Happens: Moving Beyond "Themes Emerged"* (Taylor & Francis, 2018), which was awarded the 2020 Anselm Strauss Award for Qualitative Family Research by the National Council on Family Relations.

Dr. Jolie A. Sheffer is professor of English and American Studies and the director of the Institute for the Study of Culture and Society at Bowling Green State University.
