

Applied Servant Leadership: A Practical Approach

Abstract:

Leadership is a people business that requires courage, character and vulnerability. This workshop enables participants to explore the facets of servant leadership by developing their personal mission statement, learning how to effectively address conflict, and understanding the value of building relationships with students, faculty and staff.

Participant Outcomes:

Participants will...

1. Explore their reasons for serving as a leader.
2. Develop their personal mission statement.
3. Focus on the value of relationships and the role of unintended bias.
4. Learn how to effectively prepare for and address conflict.

Session Outline:

1. Introduction, overview and workshop goals. (10 minutes)
2. Explore reasons for serving as a leader. (15 minutes)
3. Develop personal mission statements for serving as a leader, focused on service, relationships, courage and character. This activity will also incorporate focusing on relationships and areas of unintended bias. (40 minutes)
4. Learn how to address conflict through preparation and documentation. (30 minutes)
5. Conclusion (10 minutes)
