Material submitted to **Educational Considerations** may vary in length from a paragraph to 4,000 words. All material, including quoted information and footnotes, is to be typed double-spaced. Footnotes should be listed at the end of the manuscripts. Headings should not be underlined. **ONCE AN ARTICLE IS ACCEPTED FOR PUBLICATION, THE AUTHOR WILL BE REQUIRED TO SUBMIT THE FINAL VERSION ON DISK.** Disk requirements are Macintosh 3.5" drive in Word 5.0 or higher format. The author's complete name, address and telephone number should be typed on a separate sheet and attached to the original copy of the manuscript. Three copies of each manuscript are to be submitted. Photographs, drawings, cartoons, and other illustrations are

welcome. Authors should be prepared to provide copies of permission to quote copyrighted materials. Queries concerning proposed articles or reviews are welcome. The editors reserve the right to make grammatical corrections and minor changes in article texts to improve clarity. Address questions regarding specific styles to the Editor.
